### 1. Role

- a. The Yard Committee was born out of the pandemic. Those 3 years made clear that the yard is a vital, even central, place for worship, celebration, and gatherings. The committee was charged with developing a strategic plan to create a space that is welcoming and accessible, functional for programming, productive and attractive to new members and revenue, restorative, and sustainable.

## 2. Actions

#### a. Qtr 1 Actions

- i. Reviewed prior committee chair's achievements, including initial design concepts and leadership/board priorities and requirements.
- ii. Solicited committee membership
- iii. Obtained quotes from three firms. Contact relevant references in the community. Selected a local firm, Field Form (FF), and sent a proposal to the Board.

#### b. Qtr 2 Actions

- i. Obtained Board approval to execute a \$10K design services contract with Field Form.
- ii. Design Planning & Development
  - Received Initial Design concepts from FF.
  - Reviewed multiple phased master design, along with drainage building materials, hardscape options.
  - FF delivered final phased design and lump sum quote for installation and construction supervision.
- iii. Communication & Fundraising campaign
  - Coordinated with board and office to set up website, emails, forms, announcements
  - Engaged potential donors and community members in 3 informative participation meetings. Countless meetings were held with leadership and staff.
  - Raised \$130,000 & plant donations

#### c. Qtr 3 Actions

- i. Executed \$125K contract for installation and construction services
- ii. Scheduled Phase I installation and finalized material selections, bed placement, drainage plan.
- iii. Committee site supervision of installation contractors and just-in-time decisions on contingencies..

- iv. Communicated updates to the congregation through email, service announcements, marketing bookmarks, and poster.
- v. Enlisted landscape architect and native plant specialists for assistance in Phase II. congregants Scheduled volunteer days.
- vi. Coordinated two (2) Volunteer Planting Days on 9/15 and 9/29 with XXX volunteers
